



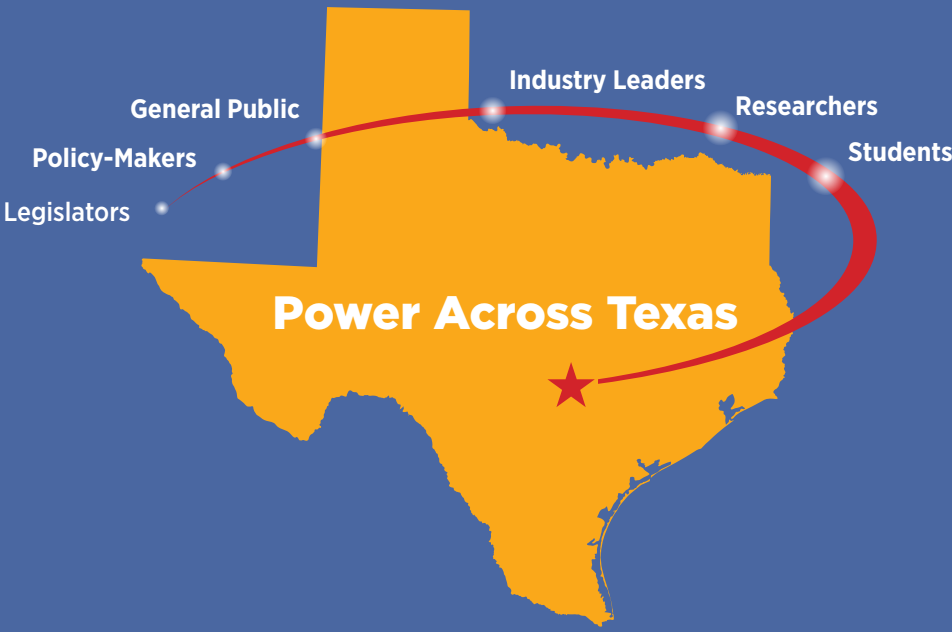
POWER ACROSS TEXAS MISSION
